We are called to serve our neighbors especially in their time of need. Through your congregation you are serving people all over the world and in your neighborhoods. New members will be welcomed at both services.


November 17 & 20: Together We Are Connected through Faith

Ministry

November/December Mission Envelopes

......will go to the Marion Food Pantry. Volunteer needs for the pantry are listed below.

Produce Pick-up - Monday and Wednesday afternoons is the day to pick up in Hiawatha and haul items to the food pantry and load into refrigerators. These are heavy boxes of produce, so two people will make this task much easier.

Bread Pick-up - Tuesday mornings at 7:00 am. 5-8 dozen loaves of bread at local Marion warehouse need to be hauled to the food pantry and unloaded. Bread trays hold 8-10 loaves of bread.

Grocery Shoppers - At variable times, roughly once a month, 1-2 individuals are needed to help with the large grocery trip. This requires significant lifting of flats and cartons of food.

Distribution - Interact with pantry clients to put together their food donations, which includes some lifting. Either Tuesdays or Thursdays from 1:00 to 3:00 pm.

Meals on Wheels

Horizons is a local family service alliance. Volunteers are the heart and soul of Horizons! One of the most rewarding opportunities is to deliver Meals on Wheels. Meals are the biggest need of the clients of Horizons. 30 volunteers are needed each day to get nutritious meals to their doors. With donors from Resurrection, Faith, and Ascension churches, we collected a total of **27 units**, which means our Marion Lutheran donors helped **108 patients** in one day! Thank you for sharing 'the gift of life.'

Our Doing series is under construction for this seven weeks. We are looking for topics and facilitators. If you have a great idea, please email donnakdennis88@gmail.com.



Stephen Ministry



Our class of Stephen Ministers are busy reading and learning. Please pray for them. Pray also for our active Stephen Ministers as they give care to their care receivers.

I am going to answer some questions about Stephen Ministry for you so you will understand all of our roles in this caring ministry:

What is Stephen Ministry?

Stephen Ministry is a system though which members of LCR are trained and organized to help provide Christian caregiving to members of our congregation and community. This multiplies the amount of caring ministry LCR can provide by giving us a whole team of skilled caregivers who are equipped to bring Christ's healing love to people who are grieving, in crisis, or experiencing other stresses in life.

Why Lay Ministry?

Stephen Ministry is based on the idea that all Christians are ministers. The responsibility for passing on God's love is for all Christians, not just for a chosen few. God has given us all gifts for ministry and called us to put those gifts to use. Stephen Ministry is a way people with special gifts for caring ministry can use those gifts to bring Christ's love to people in need.

Why Stephen Ministry?

We have many needs for care in our congregation and community: people experiencing divorce, grief, a terminal illness, loss of a job, relocation, an empty nest, retirement, hospitalization, loneliness, and many other stresses or challenges. Often people with needs suffer silently or do not request or receive the level of care they really need. With only one full-time and one half-time pastor for a congregation of 900+ members, you can quickly see why it is impossible for our pastors to meet every single need of every single person. Stephen Ministry expands the care LCR can offer by equipping and organizing members to provide Christian care. This gives us a larger pool of people with the gifts, skills, and calling to bring Christ's love and care to those who need it.

This fund has three 'buckets:' <u>maintenance</u> (building upkeep and repair); <u>ministry</u> (Director of Communications position); and <u>mission</u> (Camp Chisomo, Marion Cares, Habitat for Humanity).

Total given to Camp Chisomo for the year is \$5,250. At the end of September we have given Habitat for Humanity \$8,729 of a \$15,000 commitment. We have also given Marion Cares \$10,000 of a \$10,000 commitment for the year. Our building maintenance costs for the year through September have been \$27,584.

<u>Church Council</u>

The Council met on October 15th. The secretary's and treasurer's reports were approved. The General Fund balance was \$19,279.01 at the end of September
