

### Hospitality, Excellence, and Determination - the gifts of the Magi

"In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage." Matthew 2.1-2

On January 6th we enter the season of Epiphany. It begins with the story of the Magi who come to 'pay him (Jesus) homage." Only Matthew tells us about the Magi and I'm grateful that he saw fit to keep this part of the Christmas story alive. While we don't know how many there were (I know the song says three and they brought three gifts, but the exact number is never given in scripture). We do know something about them.

Traveling from the East they would have been dependent on the hospitality of others. They most certainly looked different, held different beliefs, and had different sensibilities; but they ended up at the home of Jesus - and this might seem obvious, but they were let in! We also know that they 'opened their treasure chests' (Matthew 2.11). They gave their best to the child. Thirdly, we know that they were a determined group. Not only did they have to navigate the desert, but also the obstacles of Herod and his ulterior motives. They persevered.

As we begin 2021 (thank you, Lord!), I wonder if these three concepts might also serve us well - Hospitality, Excellence, and Determination? How can we be more hospitable and kind to our community and to each other? What would it mean to work on this? Can we strive for excellence in all that we do? Can we recognize that we all have different gifts, talents and abilities and commit to offering the very best this year at LCR? And finally, as we emerge from what has been a horrendous year, can we muster the determination to move joyfully into our next chapter? I think we can! And I'm excited about this New Year. And when we bring hospitality, excellence, and determination to our mutual work here at LCR, the gift of the Magi will live on in us!

the flames will not consume you.


For I am the Lord your God." - Isaiah 43:2-3

Stewardship - Storm damage update was given. Team proposes delaying further floor repairs to

2022. Discussion of a capital spending plan and projections for 5- and 10- year plans.

*Outreach* - Suggested staff appreciation due to current 'virtual church' climate; discussed team goals and church re-opening logistics.

*Communications* - Paradigm equipment all installed; training will begin after new year.

<u>Old/New Business</u> - List being compiled of offices that need to be filled for Annual Mtg roster. Will be shared with Nominating Cmte. Discussion of LCR mission and identity - needs update?
