



Well....we did it!

Actually, you did it. You did a simple thing that started with a soup supper and a few dollars each night during the season of Lent. And those soups and those dollars became a lot of soups and a lot of dollars and, this past week, we used that money and drilled a well in Malawi, Africa that will be used by thousands of people in Ramusi village for years to come.



It's a little bit more than just drilling a well, though. You supported local companies in Malawi, building up their economy and providing labor for hard-working individuals. You encouraged a community, showing them that their health and access to clean drinking water MATTERS. It matters to people in their village but it also matters to people across the world. And you impacted the health and wellness of the greatest population to live in this village: the children. It is estimated that over 50% of the population of Malawi are children, and on the Camp Chisomo campus, the population is 98% children. That means your soups and your dollars helped bring a future and a hope directly to the children in this village that visit campus each day.

These last few weeks of summer, I have seen countless children utilize the water box that sits in the LCR parking lot, looking for water to drink while they play at the park. We see LCR members drop off bottles of water to fill the box, and we as staff hear the thank you's from the neighborhood children that are happy to have cold water during the middle of the day.

Please hear me when I tell you that in the same way, we see countless children use the water wells that LCR has provided for the community in Ramusi village. We hear the thank you's from the children that are happy to have clean water to drink during the middle of the day. You are providing water in Marion and Malawi, but you are also showing the love of Jesus to communities and families and children in both places. Every action of generosity is paired with a glimpse of heaven, a deeper understanding of love, and an invitation to know the God that moves us to action each day.

Lutheran World Foundation - Ukraine Update, August 2022

"Great hospitality and solidarity" by Lutheran churches

Six months after the military invasion of Ukraine, the Lutheran World Federation continues to support people affected by the war. As the cold season approaches, there is a need to rehabilitate homes and public buildings which have been destroyed or damaged. In addition, there is an increasing need for psycho-social support as well as pastoral care. LWF supports people in Ukraine, as well as refugees in the neighboring countries, with direct humanitarian aid and through its member churches.



Much of this work has been made possible through the donations of LWF member churches, who have generously contributed to the LWF response. In a unique partnership, LWF has combined funds and infrastructure from the UN refugee agency UNHCR, its own technical expertise and coordination experience in humanitarian work, with the deep connection of its member churches with local communities.

"It's humbling to see this strong response by the churches," says Eva Christina Nilsson, LWF Director of Mission, Theology, and Justice. "The LWF member churches, both in Ukraine and the neighboring countries have shown great hospitality and solidarity with people suffering from the war. They have opened up their parish houses, their homes, and taken concrete action in serving people who had to leave their country. The churches all have a long diaconal experience which they have built on in this crisis situation."
