A BIBLE STUDY

It is good.

Take an opportunity to read Genesis 1.1 – 2.3

Did you notice that God is not just creating individual slices of the universe — but is doing so in a way that everything is interconnected? There is light and dark, sun and moon, dry land and waters. Each part of creation builds and enhances the others.

What does this tell you about the world?

We sometimes think that our faith is about spiritual matters as opposed to those things of a physical nature. But in the story of creation the narrative is almost exclusively about those things that we can touch, see, smell, hear, and taste. And, in fact, the physical world is declared to be good.

What does this say about the importance of every day material things?

Did you notice that humans are the final work of creation and that we are created in the image of God? Let's assume this is much more than physical appearance. Perhaps a good way for us to understand being created in the image of God is that we are 'to reflect God' in all we do.

How do you reflect God in your everyday life and in how you use the gifts of creation?

Prayer:

Dear Lord, as you created the heavens and the earth, so you created us to be your image in the world. Help us to live in such a way that others might see your goodness in all that we do. Amen.





STEWARDSHIP

Giving for all ages.

Stewardship isn't just about money, and isn't just for grown-ups. Your children and families can learn about stewardship at any age! Stewardship is simply how we take care of what God has given us. Check out these ideas for growing in stewardship together:

Stewards of the Earth

Gather as a family to make a list of everything you can think of that God made — set a timer to mark the end of your list making. Take your lists on a walk and check off anything you see from your list. As you are walking, chat about how you can take care of the things we see. How can we care for trees, animals or the water?

Stewards of our Stuff

Have everyone in the family take a look around the house for things that are ready to be recycled, upcycled, donated or repurposed. Turn it into a fun challenge or a family contest. Caring for the things we have and being intentional about repurposing instead of disposing of things right away is a great way to teach your whole family how to care for the resources we have been given.

At Lutheran Church of the Resurrection, we accept and appreciate gifts in many forms. We rely on your annual commitments to keep the lights on, pay our staff, fund programming and provide for many ministries and charities we support as a congregation.

Common ways to give.

- Weekly Envelopes Checks may be dropped in the offering plate or mailed to the church: Lutheran Church of the Resurrection; 3500 29th Ave; Marion, IA 52302.
- IRA Qualified Distribution If you are 70 ½ and have an IRA account, you may be able to write a check direct from your IRA account that qualifies as an IRA qualified distribution (QCD). QCDs usually count as part of your minimum distribution but are excluded from your adjusted gross income.
- **Simply Giving** Join 80 LCR families who give regularly through automatic withdrawal. This electronic funds transfer (EFT) program is a tremendous help in providing steady support to LCR. You have the option to donate weekly, bi-monthly, or monthly through Simply Giving. The authorization form is on the back of your commitment form.
- Digital Giving —

Online — Visit LCRMarion.org/giving. When you click on the "Donate" button, you will have the option of donating via PayPal or using your debit or credit card. Venmo — Look for @LCRMarion (Resurrection Lutheran).





Giving a legacy.

Other types of gifts and planned giving can leave a legacy. Though the options are endless, here are some ways to leave a legacy.

- **Appreciated Assets** Land and real estate, works of art and other types of personal property as well as stocks, bonds and mutual funds.
- Retirement Accounts Naming Lutheran Church of the Resurrection as a beneficiary on an IRA or pension account allows a distribution at death to pass taxfree to the church.
- **Life Insurance** Give the cash value accumulated in a policy, the annual dividends of a policy, or designate the church as the beneficiary of the policy.
- Thrivent Choice Dollars If you're a Thrivent member, you may allocate all or a portion of your Choice Dollars to LCR. You must initiate this donation directly with Thrivent. Visit thrivent.com/thriventchoice for more info or to direct a distribution.
- **Bequests or Planned Giving** There are a variety of ways to give through trust funds, which have advantages for short-term and long-term giving, as well as taxes.
- **Donor-Advised Fund** You may be able to set up a donor-advised charitable fund to bunch several years' contributions to maximize your charitable tax deduction. When you contribute cash, securities or other assets to a donor-advised fund sponsoring organization, you are generally eligible to take an immediate tax deduction. Then, those funds can be invested for tax-free growth, while allowing you to continue to support Lutheran Church of the Resurrection annually.
- Make an unrestricted gift, or designate the LCR Trust Fund, in a will or trust This
 allows a person to make a significant contribution that may not have been possible
 during life. A financial advisor can detail the plans available for giving to Lutheran
 Church of the Resurrection through various trusts.

Assistance with Giving Options

Consideration to the special ways of giving described in this pamphlet can lead to action that will greatly benefit the congregation's work and ministry and be of personal benefit as well. YOUR COMMITMENT

It is very good.

Begin with Prayer — Thank God for blessing you and ask for guidance and discernment. Recognize that your offerings express both your desire to serve and your investment in God's work.

Assess Your Finances — Take a look at your annual income and your budget. How is your faith reflected in your spending?

Step Up and Make a Commitment — Determine the percentage of your income you will give in the coming year, stepping up that percentage by 1% to 3%. If you are not yet tithing (giving 10%), consider increasing the percentage you are giving each year until you reach ten percent. Complete either the Online Commitment Form at LCRMarion.org or a printed Commitment Form with your projected annual offering (and one-time gift to our Music Ministry for 2023, if desired). Remember your annual commitment of tithes and offerings supports Resurrection's ministries both within and outside the walls of our church.

Consider How You Give — Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT), online, cash, check, IRA charitable distributions and appreciated stock are all giving options. Simply Giving EFT is one convenient way to give your tithes and offerings and it ensures that even if you're unable to make it to church physically, offerings are received. It is also the most cost-effective method of giving to the church.

Worship with Gratitude — During Commitment Week, November 13–16, we present our commitments to God during worship. This is an opportunity as a congregation to express our gratitude to God and renew our commitment to being God's stewards in the world.

If you are experiencing financial hardship, don't let your inability to give at this time keep you from participating and serving in church. Remember that God honors your faithfulness and that your relationship is not based upon your capacity to give. If you are comfortable, please let our pastoral staff know of your situation so that they can pray for and support you. You can contact our pastors at 319-377-4689.
