

Stir us up...

"But they were insistent and said, 'He stirs up the people by teaching throughout all Judea, from Galilee where he began even to this place." *Luke 23.5*

The traditional prayers of Advent begin with the provocative two words, "Stir up." It is an image that may seem out of place in our culture, when it appears that this is just the problem - everything is all stirred up. But the wisdom of Advent is not to agitate for the sake of anxiety but to stir up within us those qualities and traits that tend to sink to the bottom.

I wonder when it comes to our spiritual welfare what is it that needs to be stirred? I'm not suggesting a kind of faith based "attack ad" blitz like we experienced leading up to the elections - that is simple agitation. No, I'm thinking about those deeper longings; what the carol writer called "the hopes and fears of all the years."

You may have your own list, but here is mine.

Peace. I am going to be intentional this Advent to take some quiet moments to be with God. All the decorations even the tree can facilitate this. I have a spiritual habit of focusing on one ornament, on one image and allowing that image to help me slow down and hear the voice of God that often comes in the "sound of sheer silence." (1 Kings 19.12)

Empathy. With all the bad news: atrocities, wars, rancor, and discord, I have found it easy to suffer from empathy fatigue. There are moments when it feels like just too much to care. This Advent I am going to intentionally try to feel, pray for, and connect with one individual - outside my usual tribe - each and every day. It might seem strange, but I want my heart to ache again in the midst of the suffering of others.

Joy. I am planning to seek out joy this Advent. To create moments where my spirit can sing. To put myself in position to feel the wonder of God's love and to let that wash over me.

Stir up in me, O Lord, peace, empathy, and joy. - Pastor Jeff

Christmas Eve Worship


We'll have worship at 1:00 pm, 3:00 pm, 4:30 pm, 7:00 pm, and a late evening service at 10:00 pm.

Advent Hymns from Around the World

The Lutheran World Federation (LWF) member churches expectantly await the coming of Jesus Christ this Advent. LWF will mark the period with a 28-day calendar of Advent hymns. This is the fifth year that Advent hymns are shared by LWF Member Churches and Country Programs.

"Advent: A Singing Communion has been a creative expression of our shared Lutheran identity and the diverse contexts of the member churches," said LWF General Secretary Rev. Anne Burghardt. "For five years, the hymns have shown us how we share in our tradition of 'expectant waiting' for Christ's coming into the world. This witness of 'expectant waiting' brings us together as a communion built on God's promises." The churches offering hymns this year include Augustinian Lutheran Church of Guatemala, The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, the Pakpak Dairi Christian Protestant Church in Indonesia, the Church of Norway, The Evangelical Lutheran Church of the Central African Republic, and The Church of Lippe (Lutheran Section), Germany. Hymns will also be shared by two LWF Country Programs in Poland and Ethiopia. In Poland, the hymn is performed by Ukrainian refugee staff, while the Ethiopia hymn was recorded in an LWF Member Church in Mekelle, Tigray. The Council met on Tuesday, November 15, 2022. October Secretary's and Treasurer's reports were approved.

Treasurer: Pledged giving back to 105.1% - back to August level. On track to surpass pledged amount by ~\$20,000

Pastor Jeff: Lots of fall activities, including speaker Tony Jones on Nov. 18, 19, 20. New members to be received Dec 11.

Pastor Nate: A lot of fellowship happening - connecting with junior high and high school kids

Outreach: Looking at options/gauging interest for raised beds. Will continue BINGO once per month. Cinnamon rolls & chili this Sunday. Mom's Group continues weekly.

Stewardship: Team being pulled together to assist with 2023 budget.

Governance & Property: No meetings

Old Business: Annual Meeting date set for January 29th in between services

Sign update (Bob Wolter) - approved by council. That LCR enter into a contract to purchase a new electronic messaging center as proposed by CR Signs. The purchase to include the proposed sign, new electrical hookups, and sales tax for a total of \$46,339.56. Initial funding of the first payment of \$23,170 will include the \$20,120 in the New Sign Clearing Account. The remainder is to be added to the 2023 budget plan. The contract to be signed only after the congregational forum scheduled for November 27, 2022.

New Business: Will be working with nominating committee to find replacements for council members whose terms are up.
