Lutherans at work in the world

The LCR trip to the Holy Land will include a stop at Augusta Victoria Hospital (AVH), a program of the Lutheran World Federated Department for World Service in Jerusalem. It started in partnership with the United Nations Relief & Works Agency (UNRWA) as a major medical facility in Jerusalem after the 1948 war to care for Palestinian refugees. Today, most of the patients served by AVH continue to be in social need and seeking life-saving specialized care.

The hospital is now focusing much of its strategic efforts on establishing a palliative care facility as well as a care center for the elderly. This approach is in line with the hospital's overall strategy to establish health services otherwise unavailable to the Palestinian community and complements the existing services at the hospital. AVH is the first and only hospital to provide radiation therapy for cancer patients in the Palestinian territories and is the only medical facility in the West Bank offering pediatric kidney



dialysis. On a daily basis, these and other specialty services touch countless lives, both young and old, from communities across the Holy Land who otherwise do not have medical services.
