"The church is not what it used to be...."

That's true, but if you think about it the church is NEVER what it used to be. The church as a human institution has evolved in the same way that people and culture always evolve. The church isn't what it used to be because the church is too interesting to remain stagnant. From the first days of the church following the resurrection of Jesus the church has been on a journey of growth fueled by hope and sustained by love.

This is the message Pr. Jeff and I sought to communicate in our three week class called "The Ever Evolving Church." Pr. Jeff walked us through the earliest days of the church as recorded in scripture and helped us understand that from the very beginning of the church Christians understood the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus and a variety of ways and for over 300 years the church was a diverse conglomeration of communities who were all faithfully and actively discovering ways to understand Jesus.

For a time, the church also knew a time of unity – perhaps even in ways that were somewhat exclusive – and the church played an important role in maintaining a sense of unity and order in society. The idea of "one church" was the common understanding of many folks in the western world, and we considered the many reasons that the church was a dominant cultural institution.

We also took time to consider how, beginning in the 16th century, the church began to explore the idea of diversity, and how the idea of "one church" gave way to many denominations and expressions of the Christian faith – an understanding that exists even to this day.

Perhaps most interesting, we explored the way the church is again evolving into something that might resemble the earliest days of the church as we return to a time where the church is no longer a dominant force in our culture. I say that this is the most interesting aspect of the class because we were able to imagine what the church is going to become!

As I see things, we are now returning to a time where the purpose of the church is to love the world the way we see God's love manifest in Jesus. We can avoid the pitfalls of being a cultural institution and instead be the body of Christ in the world. In my estimation, this may be the most interesting time to be a part of the church since the time of the Reformation, and for me this conversation on the future of the church was a wonderful way to end our class.

Thank you all for your attention to adult education. And thank you for being such wonderful conversation partners as we explore these grand ideas together. Stay tuned, We'll do this again soon!!! - Pastor Nate






How Does Stephen Ministry Work?

When someone requests a Stephen Minister, Mary Hajek, our Stephen Minister Referrals Coordinator, will meet with that person, explain what Stephen Ministry is, and help determine whether Stephen Ministry is the kind of care that person needs. Our Coordinator then matches that person with one of our available Stephen Ministers.

The Stephen Minister will call that person and begin meeting with him or her for as long as the need is there. Everything a care receiver says to his or her Stephen Minister is kept confidential. The Stephen Minister doesn't try to solve problems; rather, he or she listens, cares, prays, and helps the care receiver find his or her path to healing and wholeness.

At Lutheran Church of the Resurrection we have 10 Stephens Ministers. 5 of our ministers currently have care receivers. The other 5 are ready to help anyone in need.


Property: Carpeting completed and paid for. Looking at Wee Wisdom and sanctuary projects over the next couple of years. Cold patch in parking lot completed.
