"Do not neglect the gift that is in you..."

1 Timothy 4.14a

I have many friends in the Holy Land, Jewish Israelis, Arab Muslim Israelis, Arab Christian Israelis, Palestinian Christians, Palestinian Muslims, and I love and care deeply for them all. And so with the current unspeakable terror attacks inflicted on innocents and with the devastation of war to civilians, with the rising tensions in the West Bank, and concern for safety and security within Israel, with the rise of hatred in our nation against Palestinians, and with the rising hate crimes against our Jewish friends - my heart is aching. In response to the current suffering that is happening, the City of Bethlehem - the place of Christs birth - for the first time since modern celebrations have been held, will not decorate Manger square. In fact, the Patriarchs and Heads of the Churches in Jerusalem asked Christians in the Holy Land to refrain from "unnecessarily festive" Christmas activities. Catholic churches in Galilee requested the same, as did the Council of Local Evangelical Churches in the Holy Land.

But let's be clear: Christmas is not canceled. In fact, perhaps even more than in recent memory, the spirit and power of Christmas needs to be proclaimed. Christmas after all is not the trappings that surround it. And don't get me wrong - I love the 'trappings' of Christmas: I love the lights, and the songs, and the festivities, and the gifts, and the trees, and the treats. But I also know that Christmas still comes when it is dark, and lonely, and cold, and violence shatters the silent night. In fact on Christmas Eve we'll say these words in a darkened and silent church, "the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it (John 1.5)." These are the words that the world needs to hear!

And this is the gift that is in you. This is the gift of Christmas' past, present and all those yet to come. That God so loved the world that he gave his only Son (John 3.16). That we do not grieve as those without hope (1 Thes 4.13). That by the power of the Holy Spirit we are ourselves light and salt (Matt 5.13-14). That there is nothing that can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord (Romans 8.39). This Christmas, I'm looking at everything in a slightly different way, and I'm straining to hear the song that the angels sing, for I know it is still there; "Peace on earth and goodwill to all."


