"There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish. But what are they among so many people?" John 6.9

Jesus looked out over the crowd who had gathered and asked, somewhat rhetorically, "Where are we to buy bread for these people to eat?" Philip, one of the twelve, goes beyond Jesus' question of "where" and instead wants to suggest that even if the "where" presented itself they certainly wouldn't have the means to buy enough: "Six months' wages would not buy enough bread for each of them to get a little." It is then that Andrew, Simon Peter's brother who is also one of the twelve, I think rather tongue in check says our verse from above: "Well there's a kid over here with a lunch pail, some loaves, a couple fish... yep, that's not going to do it!" (I paraphrase).

Welcome to Kingdom Economics 101! This famous story of the feeding of the 5,000 is included in all four Gospels; but only here in John do we get the details about the boy with the loaves and fish. I think John includes this detail for some very important reasons.

First: Never, ever underestimate what God can do with the gifts that you have to offer. If I were going to a financial institution in order to secure a line of credit or some necessary funds they may very well want some collateral to 'guarantee' the Ioan. A house, an adequate job, perhaps a long history of good credit - all reasonable. In the Kingdom of God all that is required is "Faith." Faith that God will be at work. Faith that we can make a difference/impact in the world. Faith that I am not alone but that others by the call of the Spirit will come along side.

Second: No gift is ever too small or insignificant. I can't stress this enough. Of course big gifts are exciting and a blessing! Amen! Feel free to make big gifts whenever you can. But NEVER EVER demean what you have to offer the world. Be it skill set, time, or resources - it is the selfless act of providing for others that is important - not the volume of what is given. In the story of the feeding of the 5,000 just a bit of bread and fish was able to accomplish the unimaginable!

Third: Don't be surprised if you are given an unannounced opportunity to bless the world. I can't imagine that little boy went out that day - let's assume his mom or dad



packed his lunch - thinking that he would be the means by which Jesus would perform one of his greatest miracles. And yet his willingness to think beyond himself will never be forgotten. Sometime this week you'll probably get interrupted with an opportunity to participate in Kingdom Economics - be on the look out for such occasions and you might be surprised just how often they present themselves.

I wonder how God might use our loaves and fish? Peace! Pastor Jeff Frohner

Community Financial Need Update

The Churches of Marion Food Pantry Board thanks our member churches for their generous support of The Churches of Marion Food Pantry. In addition to prayers, food donations, and financial support, volunteers from church families and the community donate thousands of hours to the pantry every year. The support we receive in all these areas is critical for the pantry's ability to continue to help our neighbors in need.

In the last year, we have faced an increase in pantry utilization (nearly 4,000 household distributions) and an increase in cost to obtain food. Our reserve funding has been nearly exhausted. Donations of any amount are deeply appreciated and make a difference.

Every week, the pantry receives food donations brought in by churches and individuals, and also acquires low- or nocost food from HACAP. In order to provide each household a box containing a variety of nutritious food, the pantry also purchases food each week for distribution.

At our current level of spending, which we have tightened significantly in the last year, it will cost the pantry:

- ~ \$90,000 to purchase food for one year for our neighbors in need
- ~ \$7,500 per month
- ~ \$1,700 each week
- ~ \$22.75 per household per visit

Everyone's contributions make a difference. In order to encourage financial involvement, we would like to offer special recognition for weekly or monthly sponsorships, given by churches, church groups, businesses, families or individuals, through a sign at the pantry and a post of gratitude on Facebook.

We are thankful to be able to put nearly all of our financial resources toward the purchase of food. We are a 100% volunteer organization, and our space is generously hosted by First Presbyterian Church.

Living Servant of Jesus!

Lutheran World Federation - Introducing Leon Novak, Bishop of the Evangelical Church of the Augsburg Confession in Slovenia (*from an interview published June 21, 2024*)

"When you have experienced something like that yourself, you can understand the situation in another country much better; you have experienced yourself how helpless you are in a war and how precious it is to have friends, brothers, and sisters who do not forget you in times of need and who do not leave you alone. Through the support from our parishes and our small-scale diaconal ministries in Slovenia (we only have a staff of three), I can take relief goods to Ukraine. I now have come here for the fifth time.

We organize these aid deliveries in consultation with the German Evangelical Lutheran Church in Ukraine; that means we collect articles that are needed: generators, winter clothing, wheelchairs, and crutches, which we then take to a hospital or hospital beds for home care of the elderly and infirm.

We collect items in the parishes and often receive help from the German Protestant agency Gustav-Adolf-Werk and other organizations abroad. I then pick up all the relief goods and drive them in a small van. That way, I can still pass customs in the car lane. So, I get through quickly and bring the aid to Odesa, Kharkiv, or elsewhere."

When asked why he does this personally, "I wouldn't like people to get the impression that the bishop sits safely in his office and lets other people drive into a war zone. By showing that you have not forgotten about them, if you come personally, meet them, and say, "We care about you; that's why I'm here!" that creates relationships and trust. In an emergency, this is the most important thing."

ONLINE SAFETY

An Important Note About Scammers

In July, some congregation members received a fraudulent email message from someone posing as me, asking for help. While this particular instance used email, we know that scammers also use text messages, and sometimes, even an imposter telephone call.

Having someone trying to take advantage of people using my name is deeply distressing.

We urge you to please stay vigilant and know these facts:

1) No staff member at LCR will ever reach out to you via a personalized text, email, or phone call to ask you to spend your money on gift cards, send money for an "emergency" or "confidential" situation via credit card, PayPal, Venmo, direct deposit, etc.

2) You should never answer questions that will compromise personal/sensitive identification information.

3) We will never have a request that is so confidential or urgent that you don't have time to verify by calling the church office or speaking with us in person.

4) Be aware of phrases such as "I'm busy and I need your help," or "this is a confidential situation," or "I'd like to surprise someone in need/church staff/etc."

If you receive a message like this, please contact the church office and let us know so we can follow up.

We want all of you to be safe. Please reach out to us for verification before responding to anything suspicious.
