Join your brothers and sisters in Christ as we continue to love our neighbors by meeting their daily needs through our social ministry and outreach programs. We proclaim the birth of Christ at Christmas, and we adore the promise that God is with us. Let us find God in the places God has always promised to be, and let us live as he lived. - Pastor Nate


