#### It's complicated ...

"God gave Solomon very great wisdom, discernment, and breadth of understanding as vast as the sand on the seashore... 1 Kings 4.29

Ever since Sunday School I have heard about the "wisdom of Solomon." In fact, the passage above and Solomon's asking for wisdom to rule is a standard assumption of his goodness. However, in just 7 chapters we hear the following, "So Solomon did what was evil in the sight of the Lord and did not completely follow the Lord, as his father David had done." 1 Kings 11.6. So which is it? Was he gifted with wisdom and great understanding from God, or was he an overly cruel monarch and fickle opportunist? Well, the answer is probably, yes! Or as I like to say when confronted with the paradoxes of life and individuals - it's complicated.

It speaks to one of the truths of the Lutheran Reformation - we are both sinner and saint. We are saved, redeemed and washed in the blood of the lamb and we are hopelessly in the words of one popular cultures assessment, "we're fickle, stupid beings with poor memories and a great gift for self-destruction." (The Hunger Games, Plutarch's letter to Katniss).

And while salvation is completely the gift of God given by grace through the faith of Jesus Christ (Amen!); we are called as disciples of Jesus to daily 'drown the old Adam/Eve within us." That is, we are called to fight against the sinful self, not in self-loathing, but in confident defiance that the Holy Spirit is at work in us. In the Small Catechism, Martin Luther writes in regard to the significance of our baptism: "the old person in us with all sins and evil desires is to be drowned and die through daily sorrow for sin and through repentance, and on the other hand that daily a new person is to come forth and rise up to live before God in righteousness and purity forever."

In other words, we are called daily to repent of the fear and sinfulness that separates us from God and neighbor; and be reborn as a new person to live and reflect God's righteousness and mercy. None of us are perfect, this is true. Nevertheless, God is always at work to help us grow in holiness. Let us be open to where God might be at work to help us better reflect his light and love in the world.

#### Ash Wednesday and Lenten Midweek Services - begin March 5th

Our 2025 Lenten worship will take us to the Holy Land as we look at the "man from Galilee." Starting with a traditional Ash Wednesday service, the following Wednesdays will take us to the Sea of Galilee where Jesus spent much of his time with his disciples. Our special Lenten offering will be dedicated to Augusta Victoria Hospital in Jerusalem. AVH is celebrating 75 years of being tasked by the UN to help provide health care and necessary medical services to refugees and displaced people. The recent war in Gaza has prevented lifesaving oncology services to children, dialysis, and women's health programs from being able to function. AVH is owned by and a ministry of the Lutheran World Federation and is in great need as they begin to help those under their care. *The Living Legacy group is once again spearheading our efforts with \$2,500 matching funds.* More information about this and the Soup Suppers to follow!

#### California Wild Fire Response

Thank you for your gifts of **\$2,392** (as of 1/28). In early January, multiple wildfires broke out across Los Angeles County in California, with over 100,000 people under evacuation orders. Sparked by dry conditions and strong winds, these fires have destroyed homes and businesses and have led to injuries and loss of life. Our gifts have been sent to Lutheran Disaster Response, which will continue to work with the Southwest California Synod and Pacifica Synod of the ELCA, to support the families and communities that will be rebuilding their lives. These funds will be used to help with immediate needs amid the destruction, as well as to assist with recovery efforts for months and years to come.




