"They are to do good, to be rich in good works, generous, and ready to share" 1 Timothy 6.18

Yes, I'm a tither, but what does that mean? I think sometimes in the church we are too shy talking about this spiritual practice. The following comes from a friend of mine, Eric Elnes, in a sermon he gave at First Congregational Church of Eugene, OR on June 22, 2025. I thought it was spot on. What do you think? Worship of Jesus is easy, following him is often harder!

"Jesus said, "Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (Matthew 6:21) He didn't say it the other way around. He didn't say, "Where your heart is, your treasure will follow." That's what we like to believe. But Jesus, in his divine realism, flipped it. He knew: our hearts tend to follow our money - not the other way around.

Which is why tithing - giving intentionally and proportionally - is a spiritual practice, not a fundraising tactic. It's about deciding where our heart will live. It's a declaration of allegiance. And it's not new. It's a practice that goes back to Cain and Abel, and to Abraham and Jacob. You see it woven into the life of ancient Israel and echoed in the early Christian community.

Now, if the word "tithe" makes you feel a little twitchy, you're not alone. In fact, let me say something clearly: No one wants you to tithe because you feel guilty. And God certainly doesn't want your gift if it comes from resentment or fear. That's not generosity it's religious extortion.

Instead, consider this: what if tithing is freedom? What if it's a way to push back against the culture of never-enough, of scarcity and stress? What if tithing is an act of resistance against fear? What if, like Sabbath, it's a practice that reminds us: I am not my income. I am not my anxiety. I belong to something bigger - and I trust in something deeper. Tithing - giving 10% of your net usable income to your faith community - has been around for thousands of years. But if you've ever tried tithing, you know it isn't just about math. It's a spiritual practice. One that reveals where our trust lies."

I love the idea of tithing (or any act of generosity) being an act of resistance against fear!

The Freedom to Dance

Several years ago I was playing bass guitar in a worship band. The music built to a great crescendo and I felt over-whelmed in the moment. I wanted to start leaping around, just as I did when I was in a cover band as a teenager. I stopped myself, however, with the thought, "I shouldn't do this, I'm in church." I was raised in a Lutheran church, attending faithfully as a youngster. Somewhere along the way, I got it in my head that I had to be 'prim and proper' in church, and my 'normal self' outside of church.

As my faith matured however, I began to notice several references in the Bible encouraging the praising of God with dancing. For example, 2 Samuel 6 describes the scene of David dancing before the ark of the Lord with all of his might. With this newfound knowledge, I began freeing up my movements while leading worship with swaying, stomping, and bouncing. To my pleasant surprise, over time, several of the teenagers in the congregation starting to move with me, jumping with great freedom.

Contemporary worship services in the month of July will bring many opportunities to 'praise the Lord with dancing'. On July 6th we'll welcome guest saxophonist Brock Whitham. Then on July 20th, cellist James Ellis will join the worship band for several up-tempo worship tunes. I look forward to praising the Lord together with you this next month!

July & August Mission Envelopes



Luther's Catechisms


Sunday Morning Adult Study in June 9:40 - 10:30 am in the conference room



The Council met on Tuesday, June 17, 2025. May Secretary and Treasurer reports were approved.

Treasurer: YTD running ~\$100,000 ahead of budget; good position going into summer months. Concrete leveling was a major expense in May.

Pastor Jeff: New members - 13 family units joining us Sunday the 22nd. Memorial funds - Designated for patio upgrades; three new heavy duty picnic tables purchased. Rally Sunday - Worship on the Wapsi, 10:30 am on Sunday, September 7th at the Wapsi Bluff Shelter. Vacations - Pastors have upcoming vacation time during summer months. Neighborhood Nights - Will likely be a large turnout, please come help if available.

Outreach: Upcoming Car Cruise-In and Car Show in July. LCR Picnic will be July 13th; theme "Lutheran Potluck." Outreach will provide drinks and Maid-Rite type sandwiches; watch for sign-up link to bring salads to share.

Wee Wisdom: Still spots available for 2025/26.

Property: Concrete leveling complete. Pate should begin parking lot sealing soon. Back door will be replaced. Gathering Space AC will be replaced.

Education: Goal of bridging youth from confirmation through high school graduation. Looking for ways to involve parents in high school youth programming.

Old Business: Long Range Planning Updates - Goal to support LCR's mission. Categorizing projects by impact and need. Committee will communicate with congregation and provide updates to the council to assist with budgeting.

New Business: Upcoming Road Construction - starting now on 35th Street and 29th Ave. Will affect access to LCR's parking lot.
