Playing the hazards

Romans 5:3-5
³And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, ⁴and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, ⁵and hope does not disappoint us, because God’s love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.

The only thing certain in the game of golf is that you start on the tee box and stop when the ball goes in the hole. Golf is a game played from tee box to pin and whatever happens between your tee shot and your final putt is anyone’s guess. You could hit a perfect shot 250 yards straight only to discover that’s right where the course designers decided to put a pond. Or worse. You can hit a perfect 40 yard wedge shot and land on the green, but if conditions are against you that ball is going to roll right on past the pin and into a bunker. When this sort of thing happens to me I tend to hear myself say “That’s life.” I do that in order to appear calm and collected to my playing partners. Deep down I vacillate between wanting that shot back and wanting to go back home. And it’s true. That IS life and I’m not the first to notice the self discovery that is made by most of us who golf. We can practice, we can prepare, we can have the best gear, and even the best swing and none of that changes anything when you are dropping your ball and taking a penalty stroke. And to make things worse, the more you pay to play a course, the more likely you are to encounter hazards. As it turns out golfers tend to WANT the struggle. The hazards are a way of measuring growth and skill. To a beginner like me, the hazards of the course are a curse. To a seasoned player the hazards of the course are a predictable measure of skill. A ball that lands in a bunker is simply dealt with. With a few adjustments to stance and swing the sand doesn't have to be a hazard at all. And perhaps that's the real insight. There are many ways to understand the struggles we face in our lives. To be fair, some struggles don't fit into a golf metaphor - and they shouldn't. The struggles that result from abuse should not be endured by any person for any reason. That kind of struggle is a violation, not a lesson. That kind of struggle deserves my personal attention, not a newsletter article, and I am available for any of you if you need an advocate. And, some struggle can be redemptive, or at least instructive. Of all the insights provided by scripture, perhaps none is more accurate to my experience than the Apostle Paul (above). The struggle always instructs. And knowledge earned tends to be better than knowledge learned.

Hearing the Still Small Voice

As of this writing, the temperature is well below zero, the wind is blustering, and I find myself wanting to hibernate under the comfort of many thick blankets. There are moments though, when the wind dies down. I find it quiet and still, almost uncomfortably so.

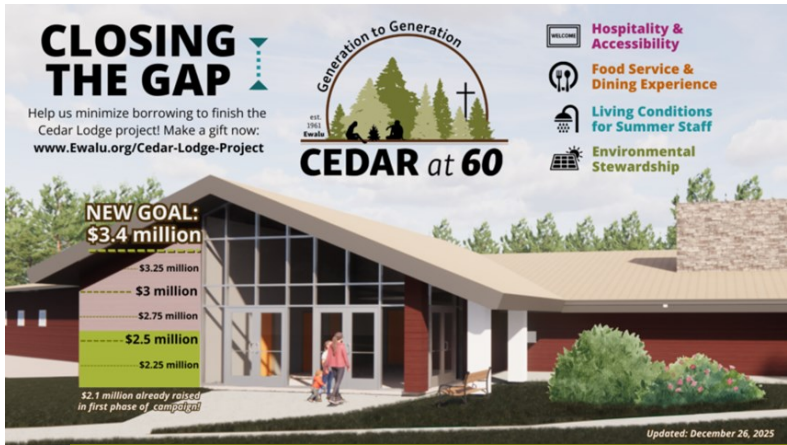
