“Faith in the Off-Season”

²⁸ Do you not know? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He will not grow tired or weary, and his understanding no one can fathom. ²⁹ He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. ³⁰ Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall; ³¹ but those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint. - *Isaiah 40:28-31*

For those experiencing an off season in your life, do not lose hope. Indeed, as Christians we confess that hope will find us. This is the joy of the Christmas season and our joy in Christ Jesus. God comes to us.

Until then, stay awake, have no fear, and for golfers out there – the off season is the perfect time to concentrate on your short game. If you know, you know.

The Council met on Tuesday, December 16, 2025.
November Secretary & Treasurer reports were approved.

Treasurer: November finished at a deficit, but YTD running ~75k ahead of budget. Pledges from Fall Appeal continue to come in; 2026 giving estimates are approaching proposed budget.

Pastor Jeff's Report: We are very grateful to staff for all the hard work put in to prepare for Christmas. Estimated attendance for Christmas Eve worship is 1,000. Marcia Edwards is retiring in January.

Outreach: Looking forward to Bingo in January; congregational breakfast and game night planned in February.

Property: Plumbing updates - Water softener being bypassed until new unit can be installed. Drains have been cleaned and scoped.

Social Concerns: LCR adopted 14 families for the Holiday Giving Project.

Old Business:

Long Range Planning - Two leading architecture firms will have more in-depth interviews in January, then the committee will choose a firm to proceed with developing LCR's master plan.

Budget - Council voted and approved the proposed the 2026 budget.

New Business:

Employee Handbook updates - Council discussed changes to employee handbook; will have until January to propose any additional changes.
