## Finding Your Way Out of the Hazards

There is nothing quite like standing at the first tee box ready to hit the first ball of the day. It is right and salutary that this is a moment of hope - often a hope that is borderline delusional. The fairway looks wide, the grass is trimmed short, and the path to the green seems clear. But as any golfer will tell you, a single gust of wind or a slight lapse in focus can send your ball screaming away from the manicured grass and into any number of hazards. Water is the ultimate hazard as there is no way to recover except to confess the mistake and take an extra stroke. Sand isn't so bad because with a good (lucky) hit you could conceivably still save your score. But let's be honest - hitting out of a bunker is beyond most of us and the experience will often end in tears. The rough is a place of frustration. The grass is thick, the footing is uneven, and often, you can't even see the ball until you are standing right on top of it.

When we find ourselves in the hazards the common reaction is to attempt some sort of hero shot. We grab our go-to club and try to swing with all our might to make up for the mistake. What's missing from this logic is the fact that if we are capable of hero shots out of bunkers there is a good chance we would have avoided the bunker in the first place. Live and learn.

However, the harder we swing in our own strength, the deeper we often sink. Once a ball goes into the water it is often tempting to try one more shot to see if you can clear the hazard without lying up (you can't). In the thickest grass, a heavy-handed approach usually leads to another lost ball.

If you feel like you are finding yourself in the hazards often in life, take heart. The hazards are annoying and even depressing but they are still part of the course. You are not disqualified from the game because you ended up in the water. The rules allow you to start again if you can't locate your ball in the weeds. Indeed, it's all part of the experience. Golf isn't about perfect shots; it's about the recovery shots that get you back into contention. It's learning from experience how to avoid hazards and how to navigate them when we put ourselves in a difficult situation.

Take a deep breath. Relax your grip. Forget about what has happened and focus on what is happening. And if you need to, take a mulligan. They are free. And remember, God is with you. In the fairways and in the hazards. You are never alone. --- Peace! Pastor Nate
