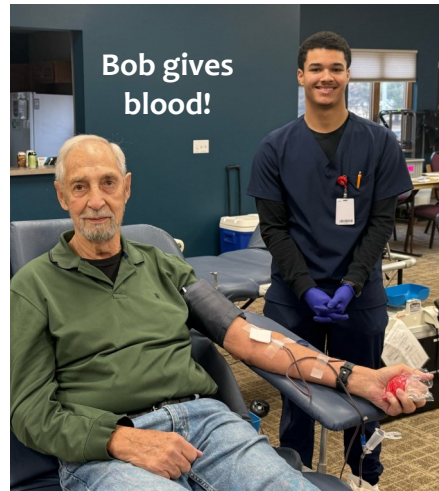
# July Volunteer Spotlights

## It's Shocking! AED new location!

LCR's Automated External Defibrillator (AED) has a new location right inside the main glass entryway. An AED can save the life of someone experiencing sudden cardiac arrest by restoring a normal heart rhythm. So what does an AED do and why have one at church?



- **It delivers a life-saving shock:** It automatically analyzes the heart's rhythm and delivers an electrical shock (defibrillation) to reset the heart's natural rhythm if needed.
- **Survival is time-sensitive:** A person's chance of survival drops by 7% to 10% every minute without a restored heartbeat. Using an AED alongside CPR can double or even triple a person's chances of survival.
- **Anyone can use it:** AEDs are designed for the general public, providing step-by-step audio and visual instructions to guide even untrained bystanders through the process.

It's good to know where the AED is in any public building and we are going to have an opportunity early this fall for anyone to come and learn more about it's use and how it can help save lives. Stay tuned.



## LWF Lutheran World Federation - Humanitarian work continues in Ukraine.

Did you know that the Lutheran World Federation (LWF) - of which the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) is the only partner church in the US - is actively at work on your behalf? These life-saving efforts rarely reach our media outlets...

**Ukraine:** LWF supports the German Evangelical Lutheran Church of Ukraine (GELCU), contributing to salaries, operational costs, and vouchers to purchase food and other items, including the set-up of heating points in Kharkiv.

**Poland:** LWF has been supporting 44 projects of the Evangelical Church of the Augsburg Confession in Poland (ECACP), supporting children in school, providing language classes, administrative support, recreational activities, medical support, and other services.

**Slovakia:** LWF supports 51 projects for Ukrainian refugees of the Evangelical Church of the Augsburg Confession in the Slovak Republic, ranging from renovations, reconstruction, accommodation, and educational & administrative support.

**Romania:** LWF supports 13 projects of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of the Augsburg Confession in Romania, providing accommodation, legal support, language classes, and integration.

**Czech Republic:** LWF supports five projects of the Evangelical Church of Czech Brethren for reconstruction, leisure activities, and a Ukrainian library for the refugees.

**Hungary:** LWF supports two projects of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Hungary, providing weekend school and short films creating awareness about refugee experiences.
